

# MILK SALESMAN MISSING 2 DAYS

Not Seen After Leaving  
Home to Go to Work

## SEARCH ORGANIZED

Peterborough, July 21 (Special).—The series of mysterious disappearances a year ago in Toronto is recalled as Robert A. McFadden, a dairy driver, has been missing here since early Saturday and had not been found late tonight as police pressed a search of the district for him.

McFadden, an employee of Silverwood's for ten years, was last seen leaving his home in Smith Township to cycle the three miles to the city on Saturday about 4 a.m. When he failed to report for work inquiries were made and a search finally organized.

Police intimated there were no theories as to the cause of the disappearance. They were able to follow the tracks of McFadden's bicycle for some distance from his home, but finally lost the trail on the muddy sideroad.

Fellow-employees of the dairy were inclined to discount the robbery theory, although McFadden was believed to have had \$25 or \$30 in change with him. The bicycle was not recovered.

Among half a dozen disappearances last summer in Toronto were those of two milkmen, one of whose bodies was found months later buried in a garage, and two poultry dealers who are believed to have been victims of a maniacal killer who himself met death in a attempted holdup.
