There entered into rest at the Haliburton Red Cross Hospital, on Monday, March 13th a life long resident of Lochlin in the person of Dalton Wruth.

The late Mr. Wruth was born June 29th, 1886 and was a son of the late Deforest Wruth and Emily Moore. He was a veteran of World War 1 and for a number of years had not enjoyed the best of health, but was confined to hospital for only three weeks prior to his death.

Although not a regular attendant at church, the late Mr. Wruth led an upright and just life. He had many friends and was held in high respect as was shown by the beautiful floral tributes.
