Ex-Campbellford Mayor Widely Mourned In Town


Mr. Long, one of Campbellford's best-known and respected citizens, died in hospital Sunday night following a short illness. He was 77.

Later he opened his own confectionery business in Campbellford and operated it, along with his son, Francis, for the past 46 years.
