

THE LATE FRANK F. LONG



A highly esteemed citizen passed away on Sunday night, June 26th, at Campbellford Memorial Hospital, in the person of Frank F. Long. Mr. Long died after being confined to hospital for only a week.

He was born in Peterborough on March 19th, 1878, the son of the late John Henry Long and Mary Dorothy Scharfenburg. While still quite young he went to the United States where he spent several years, after which in 1909 he came to Campbellford where he had since lived. In 1917 he married Violet Peeling of this town, who along with two sons, Douglas of Hamilton and Francis of Campbellford survive. There are also two grandchildren, two brothers, Albert C. Long of Peterborough and Herbert Long of Kingston, and two sisters, Mrs. Ethel McFadden and Miss Eva Long, both of Peterborough.

The deceased was a man of rare capabilities. He possessed a fine sense of integrity and honesty of purpose seldom seen. His untiring service to his community for fifteen years, for eleven of which he occupied the Mayor's chair, bear evidence of both his desire to serve and the confidence placed in him by his fellow citizens. He was a confectioner by trade and a very capable business man.

As a Mason he enjoyed the highest honour which the district can offer to a brother, that of District Deputy Grand Master. He was a capable and conscientious Mason, a member of Ionic Chapter, Moore Preceptory, Peterborough, and Rameses Shrine, Toronto. He was a member of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church.

Mr. Long's chief hobby was the art of the magician, in practising which he was ever ready to give of his time and skill for the amusement of others.

The funeral services will be conducted this (Wednesday) afternoon under Masonic auspices at 2.30 p.m., at Bennett's Funeral Home. Interment will be in Mount Pleasant Cemetery.
