

Howard Silver

Howard Roy Silver, of Kinmount, died at Toronto General Hospital, July 17, 1969, after a short illness. He was in his 48th year.

Son of the late Hazel Stata and Leonard Silver, he had resided in Kinmount all his life. He received his education in Kinmount and was a member of St. James Anglican Church. He was an employee of Canadian National Railroad. He enlisted in Ottawa in 1942 and served overseas as gunner, pte. and signal-man. He was a member of the Royal Canadian legion, Branch 441, in Kinmount.

Surviving are four sisters: Mrs. Arnold Schroter, Mrs. Lou Hennessey and Mrs. Frank Kavanagh, all of Lindsay and Mrs. Reg. McCluney of Kinmount. One brother, Gerald Silver, of Kinmount, also survives him.
