

## JAMES DUGGAN

Lochlin, Oct. 25. — (Staff Correspondence) — The community was deeply grieved on Wednesday, October 16, 1940, when they learned of the passing of a highly respected citizen in the person of James Dugan, Sr. Although the deceased had been in failing health for a number of years, his death was sudden and unexpected.

The late Mr. Dugan was born in the Township of Dysart in the year 1868. He chose as his companion through life Miss Elizabeth Holmes. They were married in the year 1892 and took up residence in Snowdon Township, where they lived until the time of his death. Deceased was connected with municipal affairs for a considerable number of years and was known by a wide circle of friends who regret his passing.

Left to mourn the loss of a loving husband and father are his sorrowing wife, four daughters, and two sons, namely: Margaret (Mrs. James Wruth), Myrtle (Mrs. James Hughes), Ida (Mrs. William Lindop), Lillian (Mrs. Milton Miller), William and James Jr.; also eighteen grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. A daughter, Pearl, predeceased her father in March, 1916.

Mr. Dugan is also survived by two brothers in Northern Ontario, and Walter of Haliburton; also two sisters, Mrs. Gould and Mrs. Gainforth of Haliburton.

The funeral service was held in the United Church, Gelert, on Friday afternoon and was largely attended.

The service was conducted by Rev. Fleming of Minden, who spoke words of consolation to the bereaved family. The remains were interred in the Gelert Cemetery.

The floral offerings bore a silent tribute of love and esteem. The pall-bearers were friends of Mr. Dugan, namely: Messrs. Richard Milburn, Harry Hanthorn and Orville Francis of Gelert, and Harold Hill, Orville Hicks and Raymond Congdon of Lochlin.
