MRS. JOSEPH W. HOYLE

Mrs. Joseph W. Hoyle passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. C. R. Barber (Louisa), at Nottingham, Sask., on June 9th, where she had made her home. She had been in failing health the last few years but seemed better and intended visiting her only son shortly. On May 18th she had a fall and gradually weakened.

Mrs. Hoyle was born in Haliburton County, Snowdon Township, on February 25th, 1866, the only daughter of John and Louisa Wruth, where she spent the early years of her life. In 1888 she took for her life partner Joseph Hoyle. Here their family were born. In 1910 they went west and farmed in the Rosebank district for a number of years. On account of failing crops in 1934 they took their stock north to Benito. Pioneering was too much for her failing health and she remained with her daughters. Left to mourn are her sorrowing husband, two daughters and one son, Mrs. C. R. Barber (Louisa) of Nottingham, Sask., Mrs. G. Moore (Viola) of Carievale, Sask., and Malcolm of Benito, Manitoba. 20 grandchildren and 3 great grandchildren survive.
