FREDERICK LONG

There passed away on Sunday morning, April 8, one of Kinmount's pioneer residents in the person of Frederick Long, in his 75th year. Mr. Long's health, had begun to fail him about two years ago and for the past few months he was confined to bed.

The parents of the deceased were born in Germany and immigrated to the county of Peterboro where Mr. Long was born. Shortly after they moved to a farm about seven miles north of Kinmount where the late Mr. Long resided until about fourteen years ago. Having made a success of farm life and also raising a family of three girls and two boys, Mr. Long and his wife retired, moving to a comfortable house in the village where he carried on a small market garden as a favorite hobby.

Left to mourn the loss of a loving husband and father are his wife and three daughters, Mrs. George Dufty of Kinmount, Mrs. Hector Newman and Mrs. Roland Newman, both of Toronto and two sons, Frederick, living on the old homestead and George of Lindsay.

Funeral services were held at the late residence on Wednesday at 2 p.m. Rev. Pellitier officiating, and interment was made in the Kinmount Cemetery. Despite the heavy rain storm a large crowd of friends paid their last respects to a true citizen.
