★ **\*\*Future Development of Former Blockbuster Movie Store—UPDATE** ★



★ As of our last newsletter in January, you let you—the Community—know about the potential for the old Block-  
★ buster store to be rezoned to allow another liquor store to open its doors.

★ As of February 13, 2012, the Hairsine Community League has received official confirmation that the City Planning  
★ and Development Department has received the application to rezone the property. The City is in the early stages  
★ of reviewing this application. If the bylaw proceeds to City Council, we will be notified of the time and date of the  
★ public hearings. We do expect this to move forward quickly.

★ Your Hairsine Community Executive members have talked to various Community members through passing,  
★ door knocking, phone calls, etc and it has been stated to us that you do not want another liquor store in our  
★ area.

★ We currently have four (4) liquor stores in our area along with one bar and one lounge. The new liquor store  
★ would occupy 5,000 sq ft, remain in the strip mall location by Wal-Mart where the Clareview Recreation Centre  
★ is undergoing a new face lift that would bring more sports, more families, and more children to our area.

★ We are asking you to please contact Sarah Ramey, City Planner, to let her know if you are or are not in favour. It  
★ is important for us to let our voices be heard. You can contact Sarah at 780-496-6214 or you can email her at

★ I have left the original information about the rezoning request below. Please take a moment to read and to let  
★ Sarah know what you think.

★ You are more than welcome to contact any members of your Executive Committee in this regards too.



★ *On December 7, 2011, we had a meeting with representatives from Parioplan Inc and Calloway REIT attend our monthly  
★ meeting. The purpose of their attendance was to let us know that these two groups are working on having the old Block-  
★ buster Movie Store, located on 137 Avenue and 42 Street by Wal-Mart, re-zoned to be a 5,000 sq ft liquor store. They  
★ informed us that they sent out approximately 200 letters to area residents that would be directly affected by the re-zoning.  
★ As the Hairsine Community encompasses a large area, the Executive Members realized that the 200 letters were not  
★ enough to inform the Community.*

★ *Our understanding is that the above mentioned groups will add an additional liquor store to our area, bringing the total to  
★ five (5) in a short distance from each other. As your Executive, we have given our answer as “No” to this redevelopment  
★ and informed the representatives we would prefer to see that store turned into a more community friendly development.*

★ *We have been informed that they are still applying to the City of Edmonton to have this location re-zoned. By law, they are  
★ to notify us with 20 business days as to the date of the application. We, as a Community, do have a say in what can be  
★ built in our area. Please access our website as we will be updating it with any information we receive. We have also in-  
★ cluded the letter that was sent out in November for your information.*

Northeast Zone Baseball offers programs for boys and girls from 4 to 19 years of age.

**BlastBall** is once-a-week program is held on Thursday evenings from the beginning of May to the end of June and is designed to introduce the sport of baseball to 4 & 5 year old boys and girls. BlastBall teaches all of the basic skills in a fun and exciting way, with continuous action and simple to follow rules. Teams are small – a maximum of 5 kids. Register yourself or bring a group of friends and register as a team.

**Rally Cap** is a program for 6 & 7 year old boys and girls. Teams play twice a week on Monday & Wednesdays. It is a grassroots program with an emphasis on skill development. It is designed to teach baseball skills, rules and strategy. It teaches competitiveness with an emphasis on good sportsmanship. Each team has 6 players and allows players to improve their different skills. Three teams meet at the diamond with 2 teams playing a game while 1 team practices in the outfield. The teams rotate throughout the time slot for equal playing and practice time. Check out the Rally Cap & Tournament pages for information on these fun events for our Rally Cap players.

**Sr. Rookie** is for 8 & 9 year old boys and girls and is a continuation of the Rally Cap program. Emphasis remains on skill development and sportsmanship. Two teams of 9 players meet at the diamond for games on Mondays and Wednesdays. Expect to practice once a week. Sr. Rookie teams play in our NEZ League and wind up their season with playoffs. Teams participate in the NEZ Rookie Tournament and in Rally Cap Days. Check out the Rally Cap & Tournament pages for information on these events.

**Mosquito Baseball** is for 10 & 11 year old boys and girls and is the category where players start to pitch. NEZ Baseball follows the Baseball Canada pitch-count rules so all players are encouraged to learn to pitch. Our Mosquito teams play on Tuesdays & Thursdays in a league with Sherwood Park, Fort Saskatchewan and Ardrossan. Mosquito teams play in our Tournament and participate in Rally Cap Days. Weekly pitching clinics are held throughout the season. Expect a team practice once a week. Check out the Rally Cap, Tournament and Player Clinic pages for more information.

**Peewee Baseball** is for 12 & 13 year old boys and girls. Teams play Mondays & Wednesdays in a league with Sherwood Park, Fort Saskatchewan, and Ardrossan. Baseball Canada pitch-count rules are followed so all players are encouraged to continue to develop their pitching skills. Weekly pitching clinics are held throughout the season. Expect a team practice once a week. Peewee teams participate in our NEZ Tournament. Check out the Tournament and Player Clinic page for more information.

**Bantam Baseball** is for 14 & 15 year olds. Midget Baseball is for 16, 17 & 18 year olds. Both boys and girls are welcome to play. NEZ Bantam & Midget teams play in the Baseball Alberta Edmonton Rural & Recreation Baseball League and games may be played on any day of the week, throughout the Capital region. The season is May and June with playoffs ending at the end of June.

## National Umpire Certification Program

The Baseball season begins in May and extends throughout the summer for the Rep teams. House league play ends at the end of June. Equipment needed is shin pads, an athletic cup, and umpire kit. Uniforms are available through local sporting good stores.

Umpires like most officials in minor and major sports are compensated for their time. House League games will pay \$35.00 per game payable in cash the night of the event. The games usually start 6:30 pm and end around 9:00 pm.

### **\*Absolute Requirement:\***

**You will need a valid Community League Membership. Without this, we are not able to register your child for any sport or activity within the community.**

If you like, you can a registration form from [www.hairsine.ca](http://www.hairsine.ca) website, fill it out in full, and bring **\*2 copies\*** of the completed form with you to the registration to speed up the registration process. One copy will be for the soccer program records, the other copy will be certified by the Soccer Director as your receipt for tax purposes.

**\*NOTE:** Registrations received after the final registration date will only be accepted on an “if we can reasonably accommodate” basis, and will be subject to the Regular Registration Fee listed below. Please contact the Soccer Director for placement availability. \*

To register your child, the following requirements must be met:\*

- must have a current Community League Membership (available for purchase for \$25)
- must provide proof of child's age (child's Alberta Health Care number or birth certificate)
- must sign up for 1 volunteer commitment per household

**\*You may need up to 4 cheques:\***

- 1 for Community League membership per household (\$25.00 cash or cheque)
- 1 per family for registration fee (cash or cheque)
- 1 per family for Uniform deposit (\$75.00)
- 1 for Volunteer Commitment (\*\*\*\$200.00 \*\*\*deposit per household).

**“\*Cheques only\*”** accepted for this Volunteer Commitment and Uniform deposit.

Please **DO NOT** date cheques for Volunteer Commitments or Uniform .

**\*\*\*** It is mandatory that all children, regardless of age, wear shin pads during practices and games. **\*\*\***

## Soccer 2012 Registration—Continued

### **Refund Policy:**

**Registration fees are non-refundable after March 25,2012. No refunds after this date. Community memberships are not refundable.**

Processing fee of \$25.00 will be charged on all NSF cheques, and your child will be suspended from playing soccer. You will be marked as “In bad Standing” with EMSA until registration fees (including processing fees) are paid in full.
